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Maternity Incentive Scheme

1. Purpose

- 1.1. The purpose of this paper is to provide an overview of maternity services to Trust Board. The individual papers are included separately in the evidence paper.

2. Background

- 2.1. The ten safety actions for year 4 of the Maternity Incentive Scheme (MIS) were published on the 9th August 2021. Part of the requirements of the MIS are to report specific papers to Trust Board at specific intervals.
- 2.2. Maternity Services have been asked to provide and update to Trust Board on the Spotlight in Maternity report, the national maternity survey and the recent Care Quality Commission (CQC) visit.

3. Reporting

- 3.1. The Maternity Incentive Scheme (MIS) paper (appendix A) gives an early brief update on the ten maternity safety actions included in the NHS Resolution (NHSR) Maternity Incentive Scheme Year 4 which was launched on 9 August 2021. This paper outlines the significant changes to the Safety Standards of Maternity Incentive Scheme year 4. There is a risk associated with the achievement of year 4 requirements.
 - 3.1.1. Safety Action 1 of the year 4 MIS is to submit a paper to the private Trust Board Reports from 8 August 2021 onwards that include details of all deaths reviewed and consequent action plans. This paper is being submitted to the private Trust Board in September for quarter 1 of this financial year.
 - 3.1.2. A requirement of Safety Action 5 of the year 4 MIS is to present a Safe Staffing paper every 6 months to Trust Board to demonstrate the Trust has an effective system of midwifery workforce planning to the required standard (appendix B).
 - 3.1.3. A requirement of Safety Action 9 of the year 4 MIS is for the Board level safety champions to present a locally agreed dashboard to the Board on a quarterly basis. To include, as a minimum, the measures set out in Appendix 2 of the Perinatal quality surveillance model. This Perinatal Quality Surveillance paper will be submitted to the private Trust Board.
 - 3.1.4. Reporting Compliance with the ten Safety Actions for the MIS year 4.

4. Safety

- 4.1. The clinical spotlight report is designed to bring together high-quality, comparable metrics about NHS obstetrics services in one place for one time period. Overall, the Trust performs well against the majority of metrics and compared to the national average (see appendix C).

5. Patient Experience

- 5.1. The Oxford University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust (OUH FT) are currently taking part in the National Maternity Survey 2021. This is the second National Survey to use the new "Mixed Mode" survey methodology, with a push to online completion of the survey, and using short message service (SMS) reminders as well as an additional paper reminder. All mailings and SMS reminders have now been sent. Fieldwork closes the middle of August then the Patient Experience team will be submitting the final raw dataset, on behalf of the Trust, to the Survey Coordination Centre as per the given deadline. The Patient Perspective current average response rate remains at 51%, with 89% of these being online completions. The Care Quality Commission (CQC) final response rate for the previous survey in 2019 was 37%. It has been confirmed by CQC that there will not be a national mandated maternity survey in 2022, the next national maternity survey will be in 2023.

6. CQC Inspection Report

6.1. Maternity Services were inspected by the CQC in May 2021. The CQC inspection report is due to be published at the beginning of September 2021. When this is published an action plan will be drafted alongside a communication strategy.
